





MOUNTAINS, MIST, AND MAGIC

Tucked away in Uttarakhand's
Almora district, Binsar is a peaceful
hill station perfect for nature lovers,
bird watchers, and photography
enthusiasts. Set at 2,420 metres in
the Kumaon region, it offers
breathtaking views of the Himalayan
range—including famous peaks like
Nanda Devi, Kedarnath, and Trishul,
all part of a vast 300 km stretch
visible from here.

The Binsar Wildlife Sanctuary is home to over 200 bird species and diverse plant life (ruby red rhododendrons and oak trees), making it a true treat for wildlife enthusiasts.

Binsar enjoys cool weather yearround, with summers being mild and
winters quite chilly. The best time to
visit is during summer or early
winter, when you can catch magical
sunrises and sunsets. Travelling here
is easy via motorable roads, trains,
buses and flights. The nearest
railway station is Kathgodam
(around 100 km away), whereas
the closest airport is in Kathgodam
(nearly 120 km away).

While visiting, you can also explore nearby gems like Kausani, Ranikhet, Jageshwar, or Chaukori. And don't miss the peaceful Bineshwar Mahadev Temple—an important spiritual site nestled in this scenic retreat. Binsar is a charming and picturesque destination where you may unwind and give your tired spirit some much-needed rest.


